

2018 Match Program

Welcome to the newly formulated 2018 firearm match program! To simplify and encourage more members to participate, this year's competition program has new features and two levels of competition. The Club Championship Series will consist of an even number of matches in each discipline (total 12 matches). The Individual Discipline Championship series will be determined from competition in ALL events within the respective discipline. Doing this will provide an opportunity for shooters in each shooting discipline to compete and be recognized for excellence only in their chosen discipline, while maintaining the tradition of recognizing an overall Club Champion demonstrating excellence in all three disciplines.

2018 Club Championship Series:

Members will compete in 4 pistol, 4 rifle and 4 shotgun matches that will be used to determine placement in the overall Club Championship using a combined score from the total of 12 matches. Included matches (listed below) are indicated on the Club Calendar with an asterix (*)

Low score wins 1st place, followed with 2nd and 3rd place finishers (including ties) being recognized at the Annual Dinner in November.

The highest single score will be dropped from total points at the end of the season. In the case when matches (of any discipline) offer separate divisions of competition on the same day, (i.e.; rim fire/center fire) only one match (shooter's choice) may be shot and will be the designated match to count toward Club Championships

Individual Discipline Championship Series:

This year, 1st through 3rd place (including ties) in individual discipline (Pistol, Rifle and Shotgun) will be based upon participation in ALL matches in said discipline, not just the 4 designated for the Championship series. .

This change is being made to better represent and distinguish participants by both individual discipline and overall abilities.

Low score wins 1st place, followed with 2nd and 3rd place finishers (including ties) being recognized at the Annual Dinner in November.

A summary of the scoring follows below.

Scoring:

- Scoring will remain the same with the number of competitors establishing the amount of points per match
 - Competitors will earn points based on their order of finish (1st place =1 point; 2nd place =2 points, etc)
 - All non-participants will receive a score totaling the number of competitors plus 1
- Descriptions and Course of Fire are available below- scroll down – and click on the link for each to open in a .pdf file, suitable for printing.
- All Pistol and Rifle matches will begin at 10:00 am on Saturdays and Shotgun matches begin 1 :00 pm on Sundays, **unless noted otherwise due to other obligations that may supersede these times. Check the Club Calendar for specific times frequently.**
- Plan to arrive early for each match. Registration for all matches will close promptly 15 minutes prior to match start time to provide mandatory safety briefing and explanation of match
- Final decisions on all matters rest with the chair of the individual discipline, Competition Officer and/or the match director
